MEETING MINUTES

DFC Update- Angel Traynor A lot of work has been put into this year's application for the Drug Free Communities Grant which was due on 4/11/22 at midnight. We used a consultant to review our application before submitting it and received great feedback. We all felt confident that this would be the year our county would be awarded this large grant. Unfortunately, as we worked right up to the last hours, we encountered some severe technical issues. We reached out to the DFC (via CDC) immediately and continue to do so, but we have yet to hear back from an actual person and resolve the issue/find out if they will still accept our submission. Hopefully next month we will have a positive update.

OMPP Update- Justin Noel Justin was unable to be present but passed along the message that OMPP has had a great response to the anti-drug presentations they have brought into both high schools and hospitals. When asked about getting into the schools, it was noted that the public school system was not interested, instead they have gained access to several local private schools (Severn, St. Marys).

Capacity Building ASAP will be working diligently from now and throughout the summer to gain capacity, especially in the form of community outreach events and raising coalition awareness along with looking back to past members, trying to encourage re-engagement.

Updates from APD- Cpl. Adegbehingbe *Shared news about new diversion* program, *LEAD which will offer minor offenders (such as misdeamenor drug and prostitution charges) who agree to participate a chance to complete a program and upon successful completion, not have to face the legal consequences. This is still new and in production, currently arranging the staff and funding to make sure it can be successful.*
