3. Strategies

a. Safe County Alliance Compliance awards and letters are ready to be distributed among the coalitions. The surveys should be given during this distribution, in an informal/conversational format to gain insight on alcohol-related policies and practices currently being

- used. The results will be used to guide us in creating the standards, or accreditations, we will use for establishments to qualify for the partnership. Volunteers will be needed for distribution.
- **b. TIPS Training** *Already have the first few training sessions of fiscal year 2023 scheduled. The Federal House has been kind in letting us use their banquet hall for the training of various other establishments.*

- **c.** Narcan Training By offering Narcan kits with training during TIPS training, we have been getting more naloxone out into the community.

d. Needs Assessment

- i. Listening Sessions, 12-17 year olds setting up date to do youth listening sessions at H20 Clubhouse early to mid August. We are looking for locations to hold listening sessions, such as libraries; groups of 10 people, groups of adults and youth.
 - 1. Video of youth Video production is in the works to showcase the H20 Clubhouse and its impact on local youth, including alumni; will use questions from the listening sessions.

- **a.** July 7th "Tipping the Pain Scale" Documentary at Pip Moyer From director Greg Williams of "The Anonymous People" and "The 5th Vital Sign", approximately 30 people in attendance, it was a great evening. The film will be shown four more times, next at AACC.

- **5.** Updates from APD & OEM Year-to-date overdose data: 65 overdoses, 5 fatal, 5 pending fatal. Out of the 65 overdoses, Narcan was reported used 45 times. Ward 6 had the highest number of overdoses (20). Interns recently completed a PSA on prevention. OIT programs funded for FY23.

6. OMPP Update Justin Noel officially took on the AACPS SADD Coordinator position. The opioid informational rack cards are now being saturated in Arnold pharmacies. An idea was brought up to partner with doctors and pharmacies in the same way we want to partner with establishments in the Safe County Alliance to promote safe prescribing of opioids.
