

## Annapolis Substance Abuse Prevention October 17<sup>th</sup> 2023 | Meeting Agenda

- 1. Welcome & Introductions Angel Traynor, Coalition Coordinator ASAP & South County Bridges, Serenity Sistas Director; Leslie Beers, Coalition Coordinator ASAP & South County Bridges; Judy Buddensick, Frances Marketing CEO; Ashley Ramsey, AACDOH Prevention Coalitions Coordinator; Patti Norris, APD Community Outreach; Loise Taliaferro, AACDOH Prevention Supervisor; Rev.   - a. DFC Update/Details Official Press Release was shared with the coalition—headline reads, "Serenity Sistas Receives a White House Grant"—a few minor edits are being made before we can officially share the entire release. The DFC is a 5-year commitment with an additional 5-year continuance, providing up to \$125K yearly. We have a 'New Recipient Training' coming up and will be able to provide more details, specifically strategies, at the next coalition meeting (12/19).

### 2. Capacity Building - H20 Clubhouse Partnership, MAPPA MD Prevention Conference

a. Angel shared an article from a 2014 Capital Gazette article in which she was interviewed about her experiences as a person in recovery and her efforts in prevention. The article was also about the county's two prevention coalitions at that time, Northern Lights Against Substance Abuse (NLASA) & Western AAC Substance Prevention (WASP), and the talk about creating coalitions specific to Annapolis and Southern AACo. It was noted that during this time AACo started to see the disturbing rise in heroin overdoses and it is when the City OD Dashboard started collecting and sharing data. A lot has been accomplished since that article was published nearly 10 years ago and it is motivating to think how much more we can accomplish in the next 10 years ahead of us.

#### 3. Strategies

- **a.** TIPS & Narcan Training Upcoming training, on track for meeting grant deliverable numbers.
- **b.** Needs Assessment Groups for Listening Sessions needed! *Groups of at least 8 participants; need both groups of youth (middle-high school) and adults. Plan to do youth at H20; suggestions to look into SADD chapters, church-affiliated youth groups, and Life of Joy Foundation youth program.*

- 4. Sound of Silence-Annapolis Update Annapolis High School on 11/8, each grade will separately have a one hour assembly, topics to include communication skills, suicide awarness/prevention, substance misuse, and gun violence. The Annapolis HS Parent Session will be on 11/14, and open to the community—details about holiday food donations TBA. Annapolis Middle School on 11/29, with a Parent Session that same evening. More details will be shared in an email blast as soon as they are available.
- **5. Annapolis Police Department (APD)** Currently have all community outreach officers out in the community as part of the Crime Suppression Initiative, a 'boots on the ground' approach to increased acts of violence. Homicides YTD=9; Homicides 2022 total=1; click here to see ArcGIS Dashboard. Due to the legalization of marijuana, the scent of marijuana no longer constitutes probable cause to search a vehicle or person, which may be contributing to an excess of guns on the streets.
  - a. <u>OD Free Annapolis</u>– Fatal OD=2 (8 pending, so ~10); Non-fatal OD=93; Reported Narcan=78. Compared to YTD 2022 Fatal OD=15; Non-fatal=107; Reported Narcan=77 \*\*More people are administering and/or reporting Narcan use.
  - b. Thanksgiving Food Drive Donations accepted now through 11/13, drop off at APD (199 Taylor Avenue); see flyer attached.

#### 6. Department of Health Updates

- a. OMPP (Opioid Misuse Prevention Program), Coordinator Bree McMorrow continues to provide Academic Detailing to various prescribers throughout the County, providing information about best practices in regards to opioid prescribing and further information about Naloxone to be given to patients with opioid prescriptions.
- b. SADD (Students Against Destructive Decisions), Coordinator Justin Noel has upcoming annual SADD Conference on 11/3 at Northeast High School; topics to include 'Sextortion' and a Youth Guest Speaker with personal experience with problem gambling and substance misuse. Justin started his position with only 3 active chapters in the County, but with his commitment, there are now 15 active chapters, not just within AACPS but some church-affiliated youth groups-very impressive!
- c. Strengthening Families Program (SFP) is looking for families to participate in the upcoming Spring cycle; the Health Department provides incentives for participation such as gift cards and meals.
